### LICE ON ANIMALS.

A Kansas subscriber gave us the following for lice on farm animals, which he says he has given several trials in the past forty years and has never known it to fail, besides it is not unpleasant to use: Dissolve one-fourth pound of borax in one quart of hot water, then add four ounces of aqua ammonia. When cool wet a cloth with the mixture and rub enough to wet the hair where the lice are thickest. He says it kills lice instantly wherever it touches and those that are not touched with it drop off, also that he seldom has to use it more than once on the same animal. Some good reports have come from those who have tried this remedy. Some prefer to use it with a hand sprayer, which throws a fine mist or spray, and this, no doubt, a good way to apply it.

Lemon juice is said to be excellent for reducing inflammation. In case of acute inflammation in the finger, indicating the possibility of a felon, bury the finger in a lemon or bind on a generous slice of one and let it remain until the pain is reduced.

Add a little salt to the bluing water to keep the bluing from settling in streaks.
