In one of the apartments at the University college, London, Professor Petrie, the noted Egyptologist, has placed on exhibition a great sheet of linen which he recovered from a burial tomb at Tarkhan, the great cemetery some forty miles south of Cairo. In spite of the fact that this piece of linen is 6,000 or more years old, it seems to be as fresh and firm as when it was cut from the original length. Burial caskets made of acacia and shittim wood taken from these same tombs, are as firm and secure as when first lowered into their resting places. The remarkable preservation of both cloth and wood is due to the extreme dryness of the soil and air.
