SELECTING NEXT YEAR'S BREEDERS.

Two-year-old hens make the best breeders. In disposing of the old stock, retain the very best, most vigorous old birds for next year's breeding pens.
The birds intended for breeders should not be forced for heavy egg production, since heavy laying weakens the hens and results in infertile eggs and weak chicks. Feed a maintenance ration until February, when it may be well to change to a laying ration and get them laying as soon as possible.—T. Z. Richey, in Farm and Home.

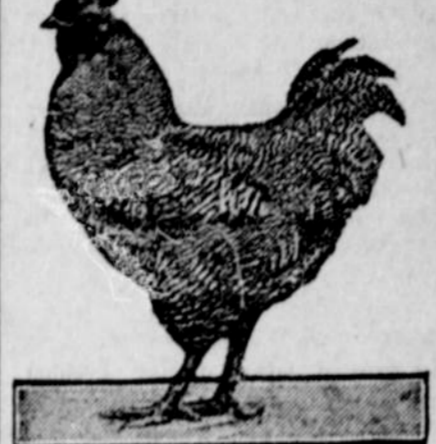

WHICH ARE BETTER LAYERS? Poultrymen Are Debating Whether Hen or Pullet is Capable of Greatest Egg Production.

No matter how successful keepers become with poultry, they are trying at all times to find how they may increase their profits. To increase their profits means to increase egg production. Poultrymen are now debating whether a hen or a pullet is capable of the greatest egg production. There is good argument on both sides. Some claim that while hens lay less than pullets, they lay larger and heavier eggs and because of the fact the eggs command a better price than those laid by pullets. This is true, but in many sections of the United States, eggs are sold without grading and consequently the small egg is able to command as good a price as the larger ones. Others are in favor of pullets because they lay eggs which are claimed to possess a better flavor

than those laid by hens. No one disputes the fact that the pullets lay more eggs than hens, but their eggs are never so large.
Leghorn pullets commence to lay when about six months of age, while many of them start at five months. Therefore, it is a very easy matter to raise pullets so that they will be laying the winter after they are hatched. Pullet eggs do not hatch as well as those of hens. Not only that, but the chicks do not seem nearly so strong and lively as those hatched from hen's eggs. For this reason, the writer would advise pullets for market eggs and hens for breeders. The question of which is the better, depends upon whether you are using your eggs for market or for breeding purpose.—Better Farming.

Should Be Made the Staple Dish for Breakfast, With, of Course, a Little Fruit.

FRIED HOMINY WITH BACON

First fry the thin slices of bacon in a frying pan, then cut the cold hominy in slices and fry in the fat. It is well to have plenty, so as to avoid the need of another meat or hearty dish for the meal! Rolls or cold bread or almost any other little ceremonial dish will complete the ordinary light breakfast, with the coffee. Of course, a little fruit is always in order at any meal, whether custom or fashion calls for it or not. That usually is more a matter of convenience and economy or luxurious indulgence than otherwise, although for breakfast the fruit is of especial value as an appetizer and clearer of the taste and whole system than at any other time. We are all so apt to have no appetite and also to be sluggish in the morning that fruit is a very desirable addition to the first meal of the day at any season.

INSPECT YOUR ROSES DAILY

Hand Picking is Good Remedy for Familiar Old Bug—Aphis Are Deadly Enemies Right Along.

The familiar old rose bug is ever present. He cuts holes in leaves. Look out for the rogue. Hand picking is as good as any remedy.
Rose slugs arrive during June and also later on. Whale oil soap keeps them down.
Aphis are deadly enemies to roses right along. They thrive by sucking the rose juice. Kerosene is effective for house roses.

In putting out roses remember to prepare a much larger opening than the pot. Mix soot and a trifle of lime in lukewarm water and pour into the hole. Shake the earth away and set the roots carefully into the hole, closing quickly and patting gently down.
When first put down allow only one main stem to grow. Remove all shoots starting from near the leaves.
Never put roses on the north side of the house, because they need all the sun they can get every day they live.

When Starching Clothes.
Put into the starch a little soda to keep it sweet, and a teaspoonful of glycerin, which imparts a dainty gloss to collars and cuffs. Clothes starched with this mixture can stand for 36 hours without the least danger of mildew.
If a glossy starch is added to the ordinary lump starch used for dark prints, the pieces may be easily ironed on the right side without making any visible change in the appearance of the material, which is noticeable when ironing dark red, blue and black prints.

Tea "Dainties."
Take two cups of powdered sugar, half a cup of butter, a cup of sweet milk, the whites of four eggs, a teaspoonful of lemon extract, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, and flour enough to make a soft batter. Beat this batter hard for ten minutes before putting into heated patty tins. Bake quickly and allow to cool, then ice with a soft icing made from whites of eggs mixed with enough powdered sugar to make it stiff.

Fruit Salad.
Cut a slice from the top of a pineapple. Scoop out the inside, discard tough center portion and shred the remainder. Add bananas cut in small pieces. Sweeten with powdered sugar, refill pineapple case, cover and send to table in its original shape.

Sunday Corned Beef.
It is well to cook either in fireless cooker and take up just right, after it has stood over night in the cooker, or if having no fireless cooker, to fully boil and have actually cold or slightly reheated.

To Clean Linoleum.
Rub linoleum over with a cloth wrung out in turpentine—damp, not wet. Then polish it with beeswax and turpentine, or one of the floor polishes now being sold.

FAVORITE DISH IN ORIENT Saffron Pilaf, Mainly Composed of Rice, Considered Great Delicacy in the Far East.

This is also called wedding pilaf, because it is invariably made and served during wedding dinners and other great occasions in the Orient. It is composed of two parts, the first being a plain pilaf, which should be made before the second part is commenced. For this first part:
Ingredients: Five cupfuls of stock, two cupfuls of rice, two tablespoonfuls butter, salt and pepper.
Method—In a deep vessel roast well the rice in the butter and add the broth. Season to taste and boil over a strong fire. When nearly done slacken the fire and cover the pilaf with a piece of muslin under the lid of the vessel in order to prevent the water from the steam falling back into the vessel. After five or ten minutes stir the rice lightly with a perforated spoon and put into a hot oven till all moisture has evaporated and the rice remains almost dry.

Put this aside where it will remain warm and proceed to make the second part of the pilaf.

Ingredient: Three cupfuls water, one cupful of rice, two pinches of saffron, two tablespoonfuls of rose water, half a cupful of sugar.

Method—Put the washed rice and the sugar together in a deep vessel and boil over a moderate fire till nearly done. Add the sugar, also the saffron (which must have been soaked in the rose water for twenty-four hours) and mix well. When the rice is well cooked the pilaf may be considered done, when it should be poured over the first part of the dish. Serve in a deep plate. If the entire quantity is not to be used at one time then it is advisable to keep the sections separate and heat separately, mixing just before serving.
