

TERRITORIAL.

Travel has greatly increased over the Penawawa ferry.

The Nez Perce Indian charged with the death of a Umatilla is to be sent to Vancouver.

Sergeant Wiseman, who was arrested for desertion at Walla Walla, the Statesman says, has been released and restored to duty.

An old woman with a basket of clams on her back undertook to cross the railroad track at Seattle and was instantly killed by an approaching coal train.

The people of Montana have celebrated the entrance of the North Pacific into their Territory. A silver spike and a polished oak tie were used on the occasion.

At Farmington, Palouse county, a man named Bilgen and Robert Tindle had a quarrel, and while the latter had the former down Bilgen fired a ball through Tindle's neck, but he is doing well. About fifteen men helped fight the fight.

At Rockport, Palouse county, the Gazette, says Harvey Cambell had his forefinger mangled in machinery so it was amputated, and an Indian got his blanket caught in the shaft of the grist mill and was whirled around several times and was considerably damaged.

Engineer Sheets has discovered another pass through the Cascade mountains. It is located a few miles north of the Snoqualmie, with an altitude of 3,300 feet. Mr. Sheets reports the approaches to this pass from either side of the mountains as apparently much easier than those of either the Natchess or Snoqualmie. No tunneling will be required. The route, if accepted, will follow up Green River to the summit, thence down the Yakima, below Lake Kitchelias, thence down the Yakima river through Kittitas valley to the mouth of the Natchess river to connect with the Natchess line there. Mr. Kingsbury has finished the survey of the summit, and is now surveying the route from Wilkeson to White river valley, above Mud Mountain, which will complete all the surveys necessary to determine the cost of building by the Natchess route. At this season of the year it is a very difficult and costly work to make surveys on the summit of the mountain, but it appears to be the desire of General Sprague to present to the board of directors, as speedily as possible, the information necessary to enable them to decide which route should be adopted, and the President and Directors are quite as anxious to be informed to the end stated.

The heights of the passes explored from Mount Adams northward are as follows: The Cispus Pass, 10 miles north of Mount Adams, has an elevation above the sea of 3,900 feet; the Tieton Pass, 15 miles north of the Cispus has an elevation of 4,900 feet; the White Pass, 10 miles north of the Tieton, 4,500; the Cowlitz, 7 miles north of the White, 4,850 feet; the Carleton or Packwood Pass, 3 miles north of the Cowlitz, 4,200 feet; the Natchess, being the first pass north of Mount Rainier, 5,000, reduced by tunneling to 4,700 feet; the Tacoma or Sheets Pass, 5 miles north of the Natchess, 3,300 feet; and the Snoqualmie, 3,010, reduced by tunneling to 2,760.—Dayton News.

MAKING GOOD PORK.

We have, within a year or two past, frequently discussed the method of feeding and general management essential to producing the most healthy swine and the best quality of pork. We have emphasized the fact that breeding stock especially should not be subject to the forcing, high pressure system that so generally prevails among our best feeders, and we have asserted that this same system, while it might be for the present the most remunerative system for farmers, was not conducive to the general health of swine, nor productive of the best quality of pork. The time is coming, however, when farmers will be compelled to look more to the general health and thrift of their hogs, on account of the alarming prevalence of disease among them. Buyers are already beginning to discriminate between well developed, well fattened, muscular hogs, and the over-fed masses of blubber that one so often sees in the market.

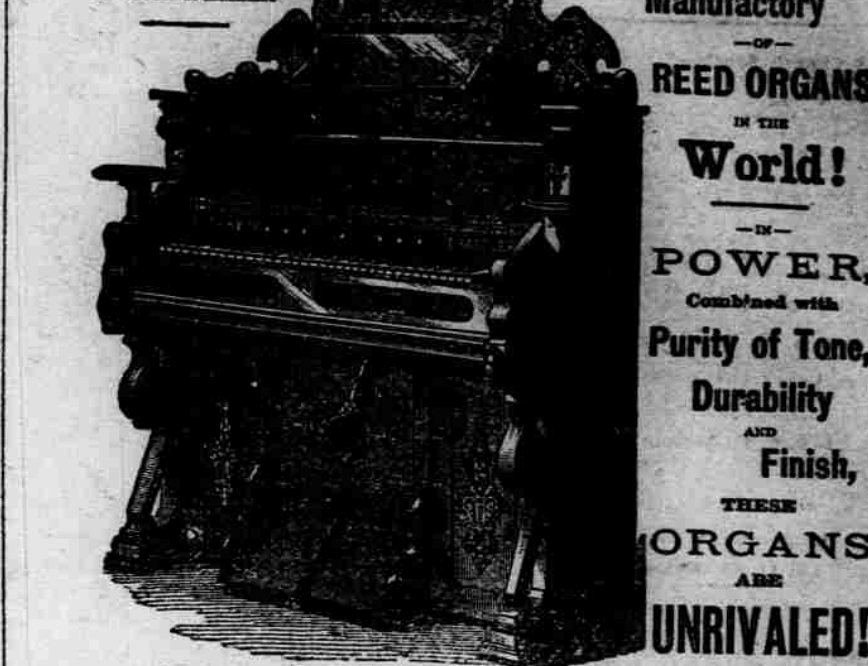
