Engineer Sheets has discovered another pass through the Cascade mountains. It is located a few miles north of the Snoqualmie, with an altitude of 3,300 feet. Mr. Sheets reports the approaches to this pass from either side of the mountains as apparently much easier than those of either the Natchess or Snoqualmie. No tunneling will be required. The route, if accepted, will follow up Green River to the summit, thence down the Yakima, below Lake Kitchelas, thence down the Yakima river through Kittitas walley to the mouth of the Natchess river to connect with the Natchess line there. Mr. Kingsbury has finished the survey of the Natchess Pass in the vicinity of the summit, and is now surveying the route from Wilkeson to White river valley, above Mud Mountain, which will complete all the surveys necessary to determine the cost of building by the Natchess route. At this season of the year it is a very difficult and costly work to make surveys on the summit of the mountain, but it appears to be the desire of General Sprague to present to the board of directors, as speedily as possible, the information necessary to enable them to decide which route should be adopted, and the President and Directors are quite as anxious to be informed to the

The heights of the passes explored from Mount Adams northward are as follows: The Cispus Pass, 10 miles north of Mount Adams, has an elevation above the see of 3,900 feet; the Tieton Pass, 15 miles north of the Cispus has an elevation of 4,900 feet; the White Pass, 10 miles north of the Tietan, 4,500; the Cowlitz, 7 miles north of the White, 4,-850 feet; the Carleton or Packwood Pass, 3 miles north of the Cowlitz, 4,200 feet; the Natches, being the first pass north of Mount Rainier, 5,000, reduced by tunneling to 4,700 feet; the Tacoma or Sheets Pass. 5 miles north of the Natchess, 3,-300 feet; and the Snoqualmie, 3,010, reduced by tunneling to 2,760 .- Dayton

Buyers are already beginning to discriminate between well developed, well fattened, muscular hogs, and the ever-fed masses of blubber that one so often sees in the market.
