L. B. Davis is putting up quite a front at his ice cream store. The new corner entrance has been followed by a lavish use of fresh paint.

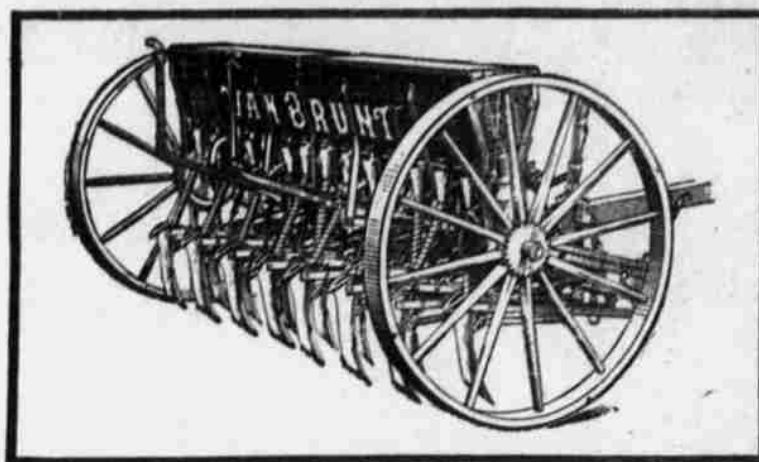
Miss Eileen Bade of Milton is a guest for the week of Miss Emma McIntyre.
