Earl Barnett has resigned as rural mail carrier on route No. 1, and Roy May is serving in that capacity.

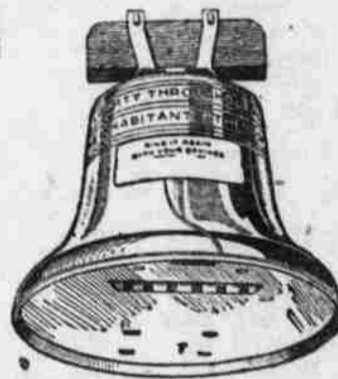
