## The Iron Rule

From the San Francisco Examiner.

The people have complained for years of the arbitrary manner in which the present Administration has governed the country. These well-founded complaints have not been made alone by those who were politically opposed to the Executive; they have been uttered by the honest masses of the Radicals who have become disgusted with the abuses perpetrated from a malevolent spirit against individuals and communities. The people have complained because a Senatorial "ring" has directed the government, and because Senators of the highest character, who protested against Executive usurpations and abuses, have been ostracized, their patriotism maligned, and their independence of character, as the representatives of States, held up by a subsidized press as the mere promptings of jealousy and disappointed ambition.

The distinguished statesmen who have brought upon themselves the persecutions of the Senatorial "ring" are the purest men that the Radical party contained. They had assisted to elect Gen. Grant, and for a long period cordially supported his Administration; but they abandoned him when his acts convinced them that his views of government would bring ruin on the country. The wholesome examples afforded Gen. Grant by the Administration of many of his predecessors were disregarded. He determined to direct the government upon a different system from that followed by the earlier Presidents. He found a model in the character of Cromwell whose iron rule pleased him, and he found a land and a people, on whom to experiment as did that tyrant for the purpose of reconstituting them; and he found also obnoxious legislative bodies to aid him in his arbitrary exercise of power.

The Senate, through the acts of the Administration, became filled with venal men, who had secured their elections by military assistance; and the House was led by those whose misdeeds should have consigned them to incarceration. Under these circumstances, whatever honest criticism independent Representatives felt called upon to make, in the interests of the people, fell unheeded from their tongues. Liberty of speech in the legislative bodies was crushed out. No language, however truthful or eloquent, could exercise any influence on the conduct of his supporters. They seemed bound to him with hooks stronger than those of steel—they were his thralls, willing to do his bidding, and receive ample reward for the servitude. The nomination of Gen. Grant, due to his military services, which even glorified his faults and lauded his defects of character. He was extolled as a hero and a sage, and his election marked an epoch in our political history. It established fulsome flattery as loyalty, and condemned patriotic inquiry as treason.

The Senators who were treated with contempt by the leaders of the Administration were far superior, mentally and morally to their adversaries, and their eloquence has awakened the people from their dangerous stupor. The tendencies of the administration of the elder Adams to make our system a strong government were not so dangerous to popular liberty as the attempts making by the present Administration at centralization. The plans have been deeply laid to effect the change. The Supreme Court has been reconstructed, and hereafter the questions that may arise between individuals, municipalities and States will be decided for the purpose of consolidating the government. The power of States will be curtailed, and even in municipal affairs, the intervention of the General Government will be seen and felt. The bureau at Washington may even designate the shape of our ballot-boxes, and who shall preside at our elections; swarms of officers not needed for any useful purpose will be created, and the people taxed for their support.

The system of government established by master minds, and which challenged the admiration of the jurists of the world, will be subverted by an insidious Administration introducing a plan which will fill every State with an army of office-holders, who, with or without pretext, will send its soldiers to be present on certain occasions, and the legislative power, corrupted by the patronage of the Executive, will severally enact such laws as the accomplishment of its wishes may require. The American people have been warned that this change is slowly and surely transpiring. Political infatuation, however, blinds immense numbers of patriotic people to the dangers impending over them; and when Schurz, Trumbull, Sumner and others, proclaim that such is the case, and support their statements by adducing facts, a majority of the people who regard them as their tried and trusted leaders, hesitate to believe them. But the cause of reform is not lost because so many are incredulous.

A great party believes that the statesmen to whom we refer have in no degree exaggerated the imminence of the approaching crisis.

But a day or two will elapse before a patriotic body called to deliberate on national affairs, will have declared what must be done to prevent the government becoming a centralized despotism. It will meet under peculiar circumstances, and its decision will deserve the cordial support of every lover of his country. Can we be worse governed than we have been during the present Administration? Can we not elect a President who will be free from the two most dangerous vices that can beset the Chief Magistrate?—nepotism and gift taking. Let us try, and fear not for the result.
