Finally a committee of three consisting of J. L. Barlow, Thus. R. Fields and F O. McCown, were appointed to so licit subscriptions from persons living on the west side of the river; and a committee of four consisting of C. P. Church, A. C. Bailey, David Smith, and A. Noltner, to circulate a perision requesting the City Jonacil to submit the question of levying a tax to a vote of the citizens of the city. It was stated in the meeting that responsible parties were prepared to build the bridge for the sum of \$30 000, to be paid for when the bridge is finished and ac cepted. We believe this to be a matter of vital importance to our city. The construction of this bridge would bring many opersons residing on the west side of the river to our town to do their trading, be sides hundreds of people would come up from Portland on pleasure excursions as soon as the road on that side is completed travel through the entire valley would come this way should the bridge be constructed. It is estimated that about \$8. 600 of the sum required can be obtained by donations, which would leave \$22,000 to be raised by this city.
