DEPARTMENT FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRES. Be it ordained and established by the City Council of Oregon City:

SECTION 1. That every chimney or fire breeder built within the City shall have at least four inches in thickness...

SECTION 2. That it shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of a building within the City to allow to place or permit to be placed...

SECTION 3. That when any chimney or fire breeder built within the City shall have at least four inches in thickness...

SECTION 4. That the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department or Marshal, or both, shall at all times have a right to enter any building for the purpose of examining...

SECTION 5. That when any chimney or fire breeder built within the City shall have at least four inches in thickness...

SECTION 6. That it shall be the duty of every person to give notice to the Marshal and Chief Engineer of the Fire Department...
