Laws of the State of Oregon. AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, as follows: SECTION 1. That at every election...

SECTION 2. The judges to whom any ticket may be delivered, upon the receipt thereof, pronounce in an audible voice the name of the elector, and, if no objection shall be made...

SECTION 3. The judges of election, in determining the names of persons offering to vote, shall be governed by the following rules, so far as the same may be applicable...

SECTION 4. If a person offering to vote is challenged by one of the judges of election, he shall immediately call on the judge who he challenges to administer to him the following oath...

SECTION 5. If the person challenged answers the questions in the affirmative, or if he does not, he shall be held to have lost his residence in this State...

SECTION 6. If the person challenged answers the questions in the affirmative, or if he does not, he shall be held to have lost his residence in this State...

SECTION 12. After the poll books are signed in the manner hereinafter prescribed, in the form of poll books, the ballot boxes shall be opened and the tickets taken out...

SECTION 13. The clerk shall enter in a column under the names of the persons voted for, as hereinafter provided in the form of the poll books...

SECTION 14. If two or more ballots shall be found so folded together as to prevent the appearance of a single ballot, they shall be laid aside...

SECTION 15. If the ballot should be found to contain a greater number of names for any office than the number of persons registered to fill that office, it shall be considered fraudulent...

SECTION 16. After the examination of the ballots shall be completed, the number of votes for each person shall be enumerated, and set down as hereinafter provided...

SECTION 17. The following shall be the form of the poll books to be kept by the judges and clerks of elections under this act...

SECTION 18. After canvassing the votes in the manner after said, the judges before they adjourn, shall enclose in a cover one of the poll books, and the same sealed, and direct to the County Clerk...

SECTION 19. The several County Courts of this State, and the Common Council or Board of Trustees or other legally authorized officers of every incorporated city or town shall provide suitable ballot boxes for every election...

SECTION 20. All ballots used at any election in this State shall be kept on hand, and in plain white paper, without any mark or designation being placed thereon...
