#### ORDINANCE NO. 105.

Be it Colained and Established by the City Council of Oregon City: That the Departments, Course of Studies and the Rules and Regulations of the Oregon City Seminary shall be as follows,

The Seminary shall be divided into eight grades or classes, and into four departments, viz: First, English and Classical; Second, Mathematical; Third, Scientifie; Fourth, Primary. Each teacher shall have charge of one department; and, except in the Primary department, shall give instruction throughout the school in all the subjects pertaining to his department, and in such other subjects as may be required. 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
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
