AN ACT to Incorporate Oregon City. ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Oregon, That so much of the county of Clackamas as is known as the Oregon City Claim, as laid out by the late John McLoughlin, excepting the island known as Abernethy's island, be and the same is hereby erected into and constituted a city corporation, known by the name and style of Oregon City.

ARTICLE II. OF THE CITY OFFICERS. SECTION 1. There shall be annually elected for the government of said city, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, the following officers: A Mayor, Recorder, seven Councilmen, a Treasurer, and an Assessor, who shall be collector, a City Attorney and Marshal, who shall severally hold their offices for one year, or until their successors shall be elected and qualified.

ARTICLE III. OF ELECTIONS. SECTION 1. A general election for all the officers of said corporation, required to be elected under this act, shall be held on the first Monday of May in each year.

SECTION 2. All persons who have resided in the corporation three months next preceding any election therein, and shall have the qualifications of an elector of Territorial officers, shall be entitled to a vote.

SECTION 3. When a vacancy in any office in said city, who shall not be a qualified voter under this charter.

SECTION 4. At all elections for any city officers, the vote shall be by ballot at the time and place designated by the City Council.

SECTION 5. It shall be the duty of the Recorder, at least ten days before each and every annual election, to cause notice of the same to be posted up in at least three of the most public places in said corporation.
