Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That Sections 1. 2, 3, 4 and 5 of an act entitled "A Act for the protection of Game and Fish" be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons hereafter to take, kill, injure or offer for sale, any Deer, Moose, Elk, Antelope or Mountain Sheep during the months of February, March, April, May, June, July and August of each year, under a penalty of twenty dollars for the first offence and double in part, as follows: that sum for each succeeding offense, Boots and Shoes, to be recovered as aereinafter pro-

SEC. 2. That Sec. in 2 of the above entitled Act shall is d as follows:

That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons hereafter to take, kill, injure or destroy or offer for sale any wild swan or duck of the following species, namely; Mallard Duck, Summer or Wood Duck, Widgeon Duck, Spr stail Duck, Teal Duck, Spoonbill or Black Duck, during the months or April, May, June and July of each year: Provided that nothing in this and the preceeding Section shall be construed so as to prevent person from killing | Patent Medicines, game tresspassing on their lands. Sec. 3. That Section 3 of the above entitled Act be amended to read as

follows: . That it shall be unlawful for any per-Son or persons to take, kill or destroy any Elk or Deer, at any time, for the sole purpose of obtaining the horns, hide or hams of the same, and the hide or hams of the same, and the with expecial care for the Oregon City trade.

Cloth, Wall Paper, etc., fully illustrating that business. The same system being observed in each department, the student buys, sells, ships, barters, consigns, discounts, insures, draws checks, notes and drafts, gives leases, deeds, &c., and goes through the entire routine of person or persons so offending shall be fined a sum not less than twenty dollars for each offense.

SEC. 4. That Section 4 of the above entitled Act be amended to read as follows: That it shall be awful for any person or persons to take, kill or destroy or to offer for sale any Grouse. Pheasant, Sage Hen or Prarie Chicken, during the months of April, May, June and July of each year.

SEC. 5. That Section 5 of said Act be so amended as to read as follows: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons hereafter to take, kill, injure or destroy or offer for sale any Quail or Partridge during the months of April, May, June, July and August, of each year, and any person violating any of the provisions of Sections 2, 4 and 5, of this Act, shall be fined five dollars for the first and double that sum for each succeeding offense, to be recovered in manner hereinafter provided: Provided, however, that nothing in the foregoing Section shall be so construed as to prevent any person from killing deer, moose, elk or mountain sheep or other game for their own consumption. Provided, further, That it shall be unlawful for any person to take, kill or destroy any quails of that species known as the "Bob White" or eastern quail, at any season of the year; for the term of five years from the date of this act.

An Act to amend Section 35, of Title two, of Chapter 7, of the Miscellaneous Laws. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assem-

bly of the State of Pregon: Section 1. That Section 25, of Title 2, of Chapter 7, of the Miscellaneous Laws of Oregion, be and the same is hereby ameriled, so as to read as follows:

SEC. 35. A corporation may col-lect and receive such tolls for cross-ing its bridge as may be plainly written or painted bon a sign-board posted in some conticuous place on such bridge, and any person who shall pass over such bridge without paying the toll legally chargeable thereat, or any emporation which shall illegally collect any toll from any person crossing such bridge, shall be respectively liable to each other for three times the amount of such toll, as provided in Section 33, is case of roads.


