By means of an ingenious process, lately devised, a barrel can now be made consisting of but one stave. This, it appears, is accomplished by turning a steamed log, of the length of a barrel, against a sharp knife of requisite length, and thus cutting it into a continuous sheet of wood of the thickness of a barrel stive. Enough of this ribbon of wood is then cut off for the circumference of a barrel, and crozed or chamfered by suitable machinery. To give the barrel a proper shape, slits are cut in two ends by a gang of saws, and the heads are thus brought to the requisite size as compared with the bilge. 


