Washington News.

WASHINGTON, March 5.—Senator Andrew Johnson is to be serenaded, and will make a speech.

The Governor, Horace Maynard, will on Monday be nominated as minister to Turkey, his nomination yesterday not having been acted on by the Senate, and therefore fell with the close of Congress.

James N. Tyner, the new second assistant postmaster general, took the oath of office to-day, and will enter upon his duties Monday.

The Secretary of War has announced the death of Gen. Lorenzo Thomas in a general order.

The crowd in the Senate galleries to-day was larger than any floor since the inauguration, and the floor was also filled. Great anxiety was manifested to ascertain the location of the seats of Andrew Johnson and prominent new senators.

The Democratic side, that formerly occupied by Boggs, who now has the seat formerly occupied by Alcorn. Dawes has the seat which Chandler occupied. Upon the desks of Johnson and Dawes were large bouquets. Burnside was welcomed by the clapping of hands in the galleries.

Vice-President Wilson called the Senate to order at 12 o'clock, and after reading the Proclamation of the President the oath was administered to the new senators. As Johnson advanced to the clerk's desk to take the oath, there was a great applause in the galleries, which was soon checked by the Vice President.

After he was sworn in a large bouquet was handed to him by a lady, and he was escorted to his seat by Boggs. All the new Senators having been sworn, Morton offered a resolution acknowledging the Kellogg government in Louisiana which was laid over at his request. He then offered a resolution to admit Kinchell as senator from Louisiana and gave notice that he would ask its consideration perhaps on Monday.

WASHINGTON, March 6.—The Republican members of the Senate are in session this afternoon, and there is a full attendance including Christiancy, Cameron of Wisconsin, and Padlock. The Democratic senators are holding an informal consultation. Johnson is not at either meeting.

The Republican caucus after nearly three hours' discussion decided that the Senate shall take the following action on the resolutions submitted: First—The resolution declaring Pinkback entitled to a seat in the Senate. Second—Resolutions declaring the Kellogg Administration in Louisiana a usurpation of Louisiana.

Some senators waited the order of consideration reversed. The following additional Pacific coast measures failed to receive final action by this Congress: Mitchell and Walla Walla's bill to reorganize the building of the Portland, Dalles and Salt Lake Railroad. All Oregon and Washington Territory bills respecting swamp lands, namely: Nez Perce and Klamath reservations, Olympia tide flats and lands, and Seattle and Walla Walla's bill to reorganize the building of the Portland, Dalles and Salt Lake Railroad.
