Economy of Fruit Preserving.

In a country as peculiarly adapted to the raising of fruit as Oregon, it is quite necessary to resort to some means of preserving in order to save the waste that otherwise would impoverish the producer.

But in the pamphlet of the Plummer dryer, page 6, it is stated that Mr. Plummer is the first man to depart from the old principle and establish a new one entirely.

But during these years of experiment, Mr. Alden was not alone. From the patent office at Washington there has been issued seventy-seven patents for fruit-preserving apparatus of various kinds...

There is one fact more we would mention, and that is, in the markets, east and west, we see quotations of but two kinds of fruit, the common dried fruit of commerce, and the Alden evaporated product.

Approxos to this is another fact. The Alden Company of this city had a meeting two weeks ago. They studied well the claims of the various dryers and especially the Plummer. They concluded that in the end it would be more expensive than the Alden and accordingly ordered two additional dryers of the latter, their former order having gone forward some time ago.

We hope that there will be a fair trial and that the people of our county will secure the best. But the Alden is a fact well established, and the others, as yet, are but experiments.

We have said this much for the reason that fruit is the leading interest of our county, and we have a desire to aid every laudible effort to bring about the best results.
