WHICH SHALL IT BE?

The question of extending the limits of Oregon City in the proposed new charter assuming some importance. Unquestionably the limits should be extended. The work done now determines in a great measure, the future commercial and industrial importance of our city.

By a careful perusal of the opinions of the representative men, expressed in an interview published in this issue, it will be seen that good unanimity exists and that the importance of annexation is generally conceded.

The gentlemen named on the committee for the revision of the charter, is delegated the most important part of the work. These gentlemen are enterprising citizens, who have at heart the best interests of the town.

Some of the objections raised against annexation are very shrewdly made. One that is offered is that annexation would increase taxation without correspondingly advancing the value of real property.

In addition to the tax already paid, suburban residents, in the event of annexation, would be required to pay a municipal tax. In money value this will be very little in excess of the amounts already paid.
