More About the Chie Platform.

Will the Herald please wastanother column in telling us how any of the laws of the United States providing for the punishment of individuals for offences committed are to be enforced inside any State? As its dec laration is general, we must deny its premiers as false or complain that many individuals are unconstitutional ly subject to punishment here in Ore-

In trying to circumscribe the pow ers of the General Government so as to satisfy the State Rights theory, the Herald has decidedly overdone Itself. and should take a rest before again discussing the constitution. It quotes the words, " This constitution shall be the supreme law of the land," with one breath, and tries to deny it with the next by making Democratic precedent superior to it.

After wasting a great deal of time on the constitution, and without making any other explanation of its text, "The Ohio Democratic Platform," than to complain that "it will doubtless be misrepresented by the Radical party purposely for party effect," the Herald comes to the gist of the matter in the closing paragraph, by giving its readers to understand that the " constitution as it is" interpreted by the Republican party, would speedily become the " constitution as it was," in the hands of a Democratic majority. The first thing Democracy would do if in power would be to construe the constitution to suit its own views, and repeal all the reconstruction laws, until such times as the hateful amendments could be smended out of existsuce, and then it would have plain sailing again.


