There is less rainfall here, and winter-snows are known in lieu of the long prevailing rains of the Willamette. The summers are warmer and winters colder than to the westward .are in Linn county. Josephine has suffered much from bad management, but since her failure to be annexed to The products of the soil vary, as a consequence, and the soil itself is entirely different. The bills and prairies of the Willamette equally invite cultivation and reward labor, while belts of timber and water courses are abund ant. To the eastward, along the Columbin, and stretching back to the Blue Mountains, -- an irregular range, occupying with its many spurs a great extent of territory-constituting the only valley of that mighty river, is a range of grassy bills, with few springs and only distant water courses, affording almost boundless pasturage upon the nutritious bunch grass that covers them, but offering few inducements for cultivation, except in the narrow valleys worn in deep chasms where the mountain streams force a way to the main rivers. These widen as the mountains are approached, and near them are to be found beautiful valleys which occupy the bead of the streams. formed by the rich debris washed down from the mountains. This belt of grassy hills and narrow valleys extends back from the Columbia thirty or forty miles, and save that occasional districts, such as the valley of Snake river along the eastern line, and also along the Columbia where the lands are lowest, are covered with desert sage brash. This may be taken as a general description of Eastern Oregon, where, except in the Blue Mountains which contain excellent pine forests, timber and water are not abundant.
