## About the Salem Wharf.

EDITOR STATESMAN :- The late article in the Farmer, about the Salem wharf, was entirely without my knowledge, but since the Bulletin bas written against it, and has asserted that I charged exhorbitant rent, now, while I used to charge the P. T. Co. nothing for the use of it, I wish to explain that I have often written the W. T. Co., for months past, to know if they would buy or rent the property of me. About a month ago Mr. Biles. Agent of the Company, came here and asked my terms, and I showed him that the wharf had cost, in all, fully ten thousand dollars, that in settling my partnership, with Mr. Wright, I had allowed him \$6,000 for it, but would sell it for \$5,000, or rent it for \$700 per annum. He never made any offer then or since, to buy or rent it, and merely sent word that the price was deemed too high. I wrote to ask them to make me an offer, but my letter never was answered. My wharf is for sale or rent, on most reasonable terms, and as the Bulletin facetiously remarks, is an "Elephant" I don't care to keep possession of. It is also facetions in alluding to my "little game of bold bluff" and the way I thought I "had them" and my " greed," etc. Perhaps our citizens may see it in that light.

The P. T. Co. never paid me any rent, but gave me a commission of three per cent., and I collected all the freight bills, and under this arrangement the wharf earned me nearly \$300 per month, the year round, with the expense of a man to tend it. The present Company has refused to make any such arrangement. Should the W. T. Co. wish to purchase, or rent, I should be happy to hear from them. and it is not my fault that the subject has got into the newspapers, though they have to do such thing when scarce of items.


