"Day's Off" may turn out to be "Wildlife in Oregon" or "How to Make Sugarless Sweets" in view of gasoline rationing, but for the present Camp Adair workers who are new to this country may want to become better acquainted with Oregon scenery, and if they have worked as hard as rumor indicates, need some good relaxation.

Mountain streams have a lure for most people, and near here is one full of fish, easily accessible, with some of the finest forest camps in the state on its banks. This is the South Santiam, which may be reached by driving to Albany or Tangent, thence to Lebanon, past Sweet Home, and then into the cool and beautiful Cascade mountains.

Cascadia, a mountain resort nestled in lacy vine-maples and stately firs, is chiefly noted for its mineral water.

Having been brought up on Lithia water (Ashland chamber of commerce please note) this tastes like heaven to your correspondent, but more prosaic friends have not been so enthusiastic. Give it a try, though, as you may like it, and the view across the stream and down the steps to the spring is pleasing. If you bring a bottle of it home with you it will taste like last night's ginger ale, so drink it on the spot if you like it.

According to the state highway department map, Cascadia is approximately 28 miles above Lebanon. Above Cascadia are the forest camps, built during the past few years by the CCC cooperating with the U. S. forest service. These are equipped with cook stoves, shelter cabins, and peeled log tables and chairs. There are safe and attractive swings, bars and other devices to entertain the children.

Yellow violets bloom in such profusion at some of these camps that it is difficult not to step on them. They should be blooming soon.

Fishing in the South Santiam is usually good, but that part of the river beginning at the head fish rack site at the confluence with Coal creek and extending downstream for 2,640 feet is closed (from the "Official Synopsis of Oregon Angling Laws").

The South Santiam highway is one of the passes to Central Oregon, where it joins the McKenzie pass at Sisters. About 31 miles above Cascadia is Clear lake, so named because of its clear blue waters. Both Clear lake and Suttle lake have fine fishing and boating accommodations. Suttle lake is 3450 feet above sea level. A spacious lodge overlooks the lake where either sleeping cabins or housekeeping cabins are available.

If a longer trip is desired, 35 miles of travel from Suttle lake will take you to Bend, a lively and prosperous central Oregon lumber city. The return trip can be made via the McKenzie pass, where you will see Oregon's lava beds, or you may retrace your steps and return by way of the North Santiam highway and Salem, turning on the North Santiam road three miles above Clear lake.

With only one day at your disposal, exploring the Santiam river as suggested will keep you busy from early morning until well after dark even in these daylight saving days. The next problem is—just how far can one go on those three gallons anyway?

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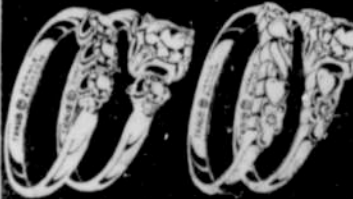
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
