

Corvallis Must Get More Pep Into USO

People of Corvallis have not yet awakened to the need of a USO service center building, it was reported today from the committee headquarters.

However, there is no doubt that in a few days announcement will be given that a USO building is assured for this city.

Federal men are in Corvallis now working with the local committee to perfect the USO service in Corvallis.

Between 5000 and 6000 soldiers are expected to be in Corvallis daily when Camp Adair is at capacity, and if enlarged, as rumored, more than that number will be in town each day, with nothing to do, and a building, or several, as the case may be is necessary. Persons who have been to other camp localities say it looks as if Corvallis "must learn the hard way."

The USO building is not only a service to the soldiers, but to wives and sweethearts and other relatives who are visiting all the time the soldier is in camp.

It is a sort of clearing house for all soldier activities away from camp. The proposed Corvallis center cannot be too big, is the view taken of those who "know."


