Week-End Jaunts

Salmon fishing is one of the most colorful and exciting sports of the Pacific Northwest and if you are interested in fishing you should plan a weekend to one of the coastal bays within the next two months.

The season for salmon is just beginning. Runs start usually the last of September and often continue until the last of November, but October is considered the peak month.

Alsea bay has a reputation of being one of the best on the coast and is easily accessible from Camp Adair, although there are many others where fishing is good. Yaquina Bay, too, is popular with fishermen in the Willamette valley. Chinook and silversides are the species caught. The Chinook averages about 20 pounds, with a maximum of about 45 pounds per fish. The silverside are somewhat smaller but more plentiful. They average 8 to 10 pounds with a maximum of 20 pounds.

Salmon fishing requires a license, although fishing for species other than trout and salmon in tidewater does not. Soldiers must have a nonresident fishing license which costs \$5.00.

Boats and motors and, if you are there early enough, tackle can be rented at most of the boat concessions on the bays. About \$5.00 should cover cost of all necessary equipment to be rented. Rent for a boat has been \$1.00 per day in the past, with motors renting for \$2.50 to \$3.50, including gasoline. There may be some increase in price this fall.

War-time restrictions have made it necessary to bar private boats unless registered with the Coast Guard. Each rented boat is registered with the concessionaire, and he is held responsible. For that reason, it is wise to have proper identification with you.

And now for the important item of tackle. A trolling rod strong enough for salmon and a trolling reel with at least 150 yards of linen line not less than 25-pound test is recommended by Jay B. Long, of the Fish and Game management department at Oregon State college. The conventional lure is a No. 4 or No. 5 spoon or spinner, silver on one side and red on the other, above a red-feathered treble or single hook. The spoon or a wobbler should be attached to a wire leader, and line dividers are important to keep the line from twisting. Then if you're really serious about this business, include a gaff hook to lift the fish into the boat.

Limits are three fish per day, but if you catch one you are lucky. Fishing for salmon, according to Mr. Long, is very uncertain. It varies with the tide, with the weather and with the time of day, so the true fisherman arises before dawn to be out on the water by sunrise, and fishes until the last ray of light in the evening. Be prepared for a stage performance if you should hook one, as boats for miles around will gather to give helpful suggestions and confuse things generally. Brilliant remarks such as "What are you trying to do, drown him?" or "Which end of the line is the sucker on?" etc., are part of the game, but worth it all when the contest is over and a salmon lies glistening in the boat.

Pioneer Dead Will Be Moved to New Cemetery

Twelve cemeteries in the recently acquired additional training area for Camp Adair, will be moved into one, it was announced yesterday by U. S. engineers, who will do the work.
