The two players whose injuries in the California encounter last weekend were most serious are Orville Zielaskowski, left guard, and Cros Shelton, fullback. Zielaskowski sustained a dislocation of his right elbow, while Shelton received a painful injury to his right leg.

How long both men would be absent from the lineup remained undisclosed. No fracture was present in either case, according to Dr. Waldo Ball, team physician.
