

Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox, speaking in New York in a Navy Day address to the nation Tuesday evening said that the Navy of the United States had "hit the enemy some savage blows and we have just begun to fight." Secretary Knox pointed out that U. S. shipyards are now turning out merchant ships faster than the enemy can sink them, and added, "he isn't sinking them so fast any more either.
