

### Red Cross Drive In Second Week

With a goal of 125 million dollars of which 66 million will go to the Armed Forces, the annual Red Cross War Fund Campaign swings into its second week.

Although no direct solicitation is to be made to enlisted men, officers and civilian employees at Camp Adair will be urged to contribute, according to Verl Lewis, Camp Adair Red Cross Field Director. However, contributions from enlisted men will be accepted.

Some idea of the scope of Red Cross work in the war can be gained from a comparison with last year's figures. Last year the Red Cross gathered a million pints of blood plasma; this year the goal is four million pints. Last year the drive netted 100 million dollars, this year the total is expected to exceed the 125,000,000 figure.

The Red Cross maintains and operates 75 clubs for American soldiers overseas.
