Long Stretch in Aleutians

Makes GI an Artist

One GI who came out of the Aleutians with something besides chilblains or Jap souvenirs is S/Sgt. Louis Schramm of 70th Div. Hq. Co.

Sgt. Schramm swears he had not been reading one of those ads querying "How Do You Know You Can't Draw?" But the weird and unique beauty of the landscapes "out on the Chain" urged him to seek painting materials. Up to that time he had never done so much as a back-fence chalk-smear.

When he was assigned to Camp Adair, Schramm found opportunity to express himself artistically in the Soldier Art Work Shop in Service Club 1. His work has been acclaimed by other Camp Adair soldier artists. Sgt. Schramm specializes in landscapes done in oils and is presently working on several ambitious canvases.

His first painting, an oil of an old Russian church near Dutch Harbor, was a very creditable effort. He went on and produced a number of oils of scenes around Dutch Harbor and later on Adak. Of late, he's changed to pastels and is doing pin-up girl subjects, with a remarkably sure touch—considering his 29 months in the frozen North.

Schramm was one of the first five U. S. soldiers to arrive in Dutch Harbor, and was there when Nip planes bombed it in June, 1942. His home is in Montgomery, Va., and he plans to attend art school when he gets out of the good old GI. At present he's working on a painting—from memory—of headquarters of his old outfit in the Aleutians.

INVASION ARMY GETS SWIMMING INSTRUCTION

London (CNS)—Every American soldier in the Allied armies which will storm the Second Front bridgeheads into Continental Europe is going to know how to swim—just in case he has to.

The American Red Cross, acting under Army direction, is giving courses in combat swimming, water safety and life saving at pools throughout England.

Nearly 1,000 officers and men are learning each week such tactics as jumping into the water from a height of 25 feet, fully clothed and carry pack, rifle and helmet—and then swimming 35 feet to a rubber dinghy.
