

Expert Infantryman Medals Given to 319

On Infantry Day, June 15, Major General John E. Dahlquist announced that 319 men from the three Trailblazer Infantry regiments had qualified, so far, for the Expert Infantryman badge.

The names of the 319 who passed the grueling tests imposed for those seeking to win this newest of infantry awards are now compiled and appear below.

Wear Blue-Silver Badge

Each man is entitled to wear the blue-and-silver badge which denotes his excellence in the all-around combat soldier in this war—physical fitness, scouting and patrolling techniques, first aid and field sanitation, close combat and combat reaction.

Overseas Chevrons Considered

WASHINGTON, D. C.—(ALNS)—An overseas service sleeve insignia is under consideration by the War Department. Staff approval has not yet been given, but it is probable that the insignia will consist of a gold stripe or bar to indicate each six months of overseas service, to be worn on the left sleeve near the cuff.

A wound chevron for the right sleeve has also been sought, but it is expected this will not be approved, as the Purple Heart Medal and ribbon is issued to wounded men.

CHRISTMAS MAIL MONTH SET SEPT. 15 TO OCT. 15

Washington (CNS)—The Army Postal Service has issued a call to GIs overseas, urging them to tell the folks back home to post GI Christmas mail from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15.

During this period, which will be known as "Christmas Mail Month" for soldiers, Christmas packages may be mailed overseas without the presentation of a request from the soldier. Gift packages will be accepted for mailing only within the present limitations of weight and size — five pounds in weight and 36 inches in length and girth combined — and only one such package will be accepted from the same person to the same addressee during any one week.
