Nobody Steals Money—But Watch Your Socks!

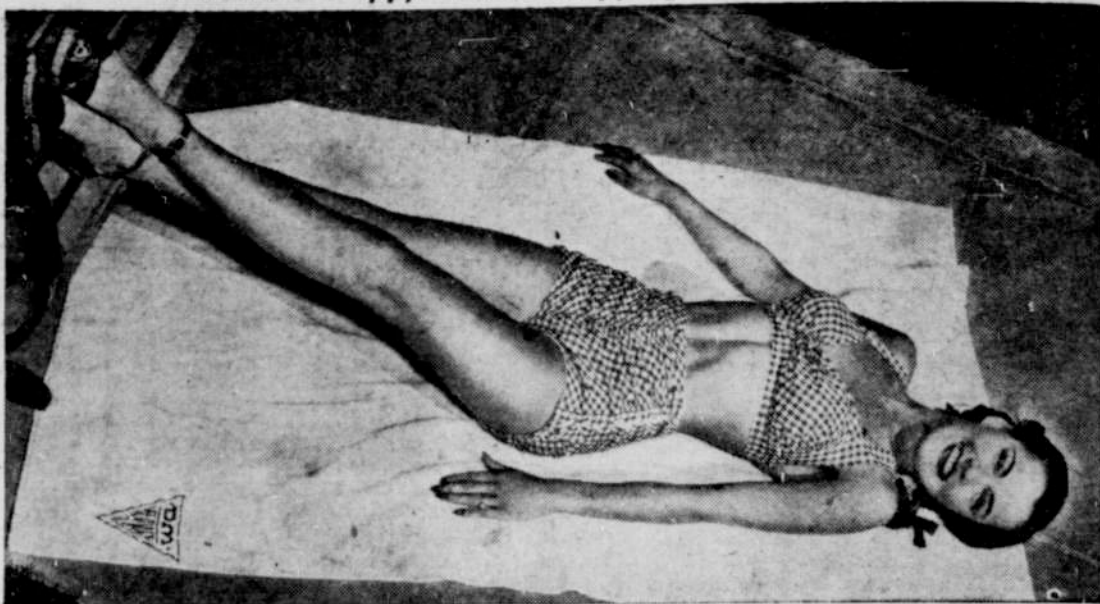

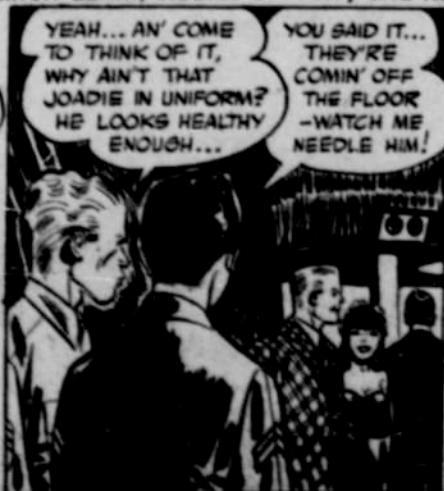
