Portland Markets.

Walter Rice, living 15 miles from Independence, Or., was killed by a falling limb from a burning tree, while trying to extinguish a fire near his home.

Ed Mahan, fireman of the Baisley Elkhorn mine in Baker county, while out hunting stumbled and fell, his gun was discharged, the bullet entering his mouth, killing him instantly.

Washington, Oct. 7.—Secretary Herbert has awarded the contracts for building the smaller torpedo boats. Wolff & Zwicker, of Portland, Oregon, got two 22 1/2 knot boats, their first contracts.

The election of officers of the Presbyterian synod which met at Union, was held with the following result: Moderator, Rev. W. A. Snick, of Albany. Sunday school missionary of the Willamette Presbytery; temporary clerk, W. H. Lee, president of Albany college; reporting clerk, Rev. Henry Marcotte, of Astoria.

Washington, Oct. 7.—The Venezuelan boundary commission will meet next Saturday for the first time in many months. A large quantity of matter pertaining to the inquiry with which the commission is charged has been collected by agents engaged all summer in this country and Europe, and much of this will be in shape for final consideration.

Wallowa fruit is on exhibition at the Portland Exposition. Mr. H. R. Findley, of Imnaha, Wallowa County Oregon, sent down pears and apples of great beauty. Wallowa County has not been considered in the light of a fruit-growing section to any great extent on account of its altitude, but it is evident that by a judicious selection of varieties, very fine fruit can be grown there.—Rural North-West.

The house of Mr. Savage at the Summit, Or. with its occupant was burned on the 6th. Mr. Savage was away hunting at the time. A neighbor discerned that the house burned and upon investigation found among the ruins the charred remains of Mrs. Savage and their three children. A caucus in quiet was held, but nothing but the bare facts were elicited.

Rosburg, Or., Oct. 6.—Two light locomotives ran into each other on the Southern Pacific Company's track about 7 o'clock this morning half a mile south of Green station. As a result of the collision three men are dead and four injured. The list of the dead follows:

John McGonigan, of Portland, fireman on the south-bound train, instantly killed.

A. N. Troy, of Salem, brakeman on the same train, instantly killed.

George Happersett, fireman on the north-bound train, both legs broken and feet crushed.

Leadville, Colo., Oct. 1.—Every possibility of ending the strike by arbitration or other amicable means has disappeared, for the time being at least. Fences are being built around the principal mines preparatory to resuming work with non union miners. The stockade to enclose the Boez group of gold mines, including the Little Johnny, the construction of which was begun by a large force this morning will be a mile in circumference and bullet proof at every part. One hundred thousand feet of lumber will be used in the construction.
