THE SUNDAY SCHOOL.

(Use read at the Last Prairie Sunday school Convention.)

It is one of our best institutions for the formation of a child's character. Often children come to Sunday School from homes where the word of God is never spoken; their parents either do not take the time to teach their children the precious truths of the Bible, or else they do not have the inclination. The children who come from such homes are placed in a class with some who are like themselves, some who are gentle and kind and whose parents are Christian people. These children are all put in a class together and are all under the guiding influence of an earnest, competent teacher. The rough boisterous ones, after a time, gradually assume the manners, actions and language of their teacher and milder companions, and so, besides becoming familiar with and understanding the regular lessons, songs, prayers, etc., they are forming the better habits of their after life; learning to be truthful, less selfish and anxious to do what good they can in the world.

Young people who are in the habit of regularly attending Sunday School are more steady and less liable to become attached to objectionable society than others of their age who do not take an interest in the work of the Sunday School.

Many older persons think it is not worth their while to attend the Sunday School, but in so thinking they do a wrong to their children for they should support, with their presence, a society which does so much good for the young people and children.

The Sunday School was first commenced over a century ago, when a benevolent man named Robert Raikes gathered the children of the poor classes of London together and taught them on Sundays. Afterward, when day schools for both boys and girls became so numerous, the school on Sundays was set apart for religious study and has so continued ever since.

At first the Bible was all that was studied, but now the lessons are made more interesting and attractive by quarterlies, papers, tracts, etc. Children are also pleased with cards, and their wish to win them causes them to be punctually in their places with well studied lessons.

Our Sunday Schools prove that they are a great advantage to society by the manner in which they are prospering.


