At a Cabinet meeting June 27, it was agreed to issue a proclamation of amnesty for all political prisoners in the Philippines to take effect on the Fourth of July. It includes Aguinaldo and all others like him.

The canal bill that recently passed Congress, provides that if the President finds that a good title can be secured to the Panama route, construction work is to be begun. Otherwise he is to order the construction of the Nicaragua route. \$184,000,000 is appropriated for the construction of either route. It looks like we were going to get a canal, and it may be the Nicaragua, but the chances are against it.

The King.

The coronation ceremonies of King Edward VII, were suddenly terminated before hardly begun last week. There is talk now that the coronation ceremonies will be done away with entirely.

In ages past the crowning of a king has been looked upon as one of the most sacred of religious duties. It was a solemn compact engag'd in between the sovereign and his people. Even yet the coronation is still looked upon as a religious act though much of the solemnity has passed away. The action of the divine right of kings does not exist except in a very few minds and the sovereign has come to be regarded more as the head of the government through the will of the people. By long established custom he inherits the throne, but his control over his people is no greater because of this fact. Even the ceremony of the coronation has lost much of its significance and splendor.

The regard of the English people for their sovereign is not so great as in former reigns. Prime ministers and great men of the empire often have a deeper place in the hearts of the people than the king. Were not custom so strong England could easily become a republic. No great reason arises for a change of government and as the people are practically in power they permit the weaknesses of the monarchy to exist so long as they do not effect the nation seriously.

But the king, after all, is not entirely a figure. He may know what his ministers propose to do, and if he chooses he may enter actively into all public transactions. Particularly in foreign affairs his influence may be felt. He must take the first steps in the formation of a new government when a ministry fails and he may dismiss the existing government, supported by a parliament majority. These powers of the king may be used by any sovereign and should England some time have a great king they may become active.
