The office of the Indian agent of the Umatilla reservation Tuesday was abolished by the secretary of the interior. Chas. E. Wilkins, agent for the past four years, has been appointed bonded superintendent and will have entire charge and control of the agency and of the Indian school. Miss Mollie V. Gaither, superintendent of the Indian school for the last 10 years, has been appointed assistant superintendent under Mr. Wilkins. The salary of Mr. Wilkins is to remain at \$1200 per year and that of Miss Gaither at \$1000.

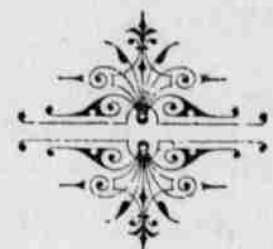
