WORLD'S NEWS.

FROM FAR AND NEAR.

Bertha Lerner, the young girl who was burned while lighting a fire with coal oil at her house in Seattle, died at Providence hospital Friday morning after suffering awful agony.

Hon. J. M. Church has been appointed one of the board of twenty-five directors of the Lewis and Clark Centennial Exposition. This is an honor that all Union county should appreciate.

The semi-annual report of Clackamas County shows its net indebtedness to be \$129,599.50. The total amount of unpaid county warrants, including interest, is \$139,778.21. The amount of money paid out during the half year totals \$50,867.81.

Within five miles of Lincoln, Neb., yesterday morning, the Burlington's St. Louis-Pacific express train was held up by a gang of masked men, who secured the contents of the safe in the express car and then made their escape.

Oklahoma Indians in a council held at Anadarko yesterday appointed Lone Wolf to petition the United States government to take all their lands in Oklahoma and purchase for them a tract of 2,000,000 acres in Mexico. This would open to settlement a vast area in the western part of the territory.

According to the decision of the Supreme Court of Illinois yesterday the entire lake front in Chicago is to be reserved for park purposes only, thus winning a victory for Montgomery Ward, who has been fighting the case for several years.

The flour mill known as the Alliance mill, at LaGrande, was purchased a few days ago by Kiddle Bros., the owners of the Pioneer mill of Island City and who also own a large share of the stock of the Union Flour Mill company. The price is said to have been about \$30,000.
