



DISEASE-PRODUCING BACILLI UN-

DER THE MICROSCOPE.

As a result of patient research and experimentation on the part of such men as Koch, Pasteur, Frankel, Abbott, Eshner, and many other scientists in this country and Europe, the physician of to-day is enabled to go direct to the primary causes of disease and by the aid of perfected microscopes and apparatus determine to a certainty the proper treatment to be pursued. In the larger cities laboratories have been established where the practicing physician, who otherwise on account of the heavy expense of equipping a private laboratory would be unable to take advantage of this valuable adjunct to his profession, can have specimens, taken from his patients, investigated under the skilled eye of the trained pathologist.




