

OMB boater registration now web-based
New system will streamline registrations

The Oregon Marine Board has made the transition to a web-based titling and registration system that has more functionality, more security and brings more online options for boaters.

The new registration system combines the old main-frame data with boater education, AIS permits and the Outfitter/Guide/Charter databases into one, integrated system.

The customer interface "RegLine" allows boaters to log in and manage their contact information, as well as apply for boat title and registration and renew or order replacement documents, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The new system allows boaters to order replacement boater education cards, purchase AIS permits for paddlecraft, and coming next year, outfitters, guides and charters will be able to apply online.

For quick turn-around on boat registration renewals, boaters are encouraged to renew online.

Online boat registration renewals are immediately processed when payment is approved and printed the same or next day for mailing.

Boaters should be aware that the new online interface has additional safety measures built in that can be confusing, so it is important to read and follow the directions closely.

The Marine Board, working with marine law enforcement, will honor any temporary permits that expired until the agency is caught up.
