More than 100 years ago, General Robert Baden-Powell created Scouting in England in 1907. Three years later, on Feb. 8, 1910, Chicago publisher William Boyce founded the Boy Scouts of America.

Since then Scouting has served young people and their families through a program

of values-based leadership and character development. Today, Scouting is found in 185 of the world's 192 independent countries.

Scouting programs have instilled in youth the values found in the Scout Oath and Scout Law and help youth develop academic skills, self-confidence, ethics and leadership and citizenship skills that influence their adult lives.

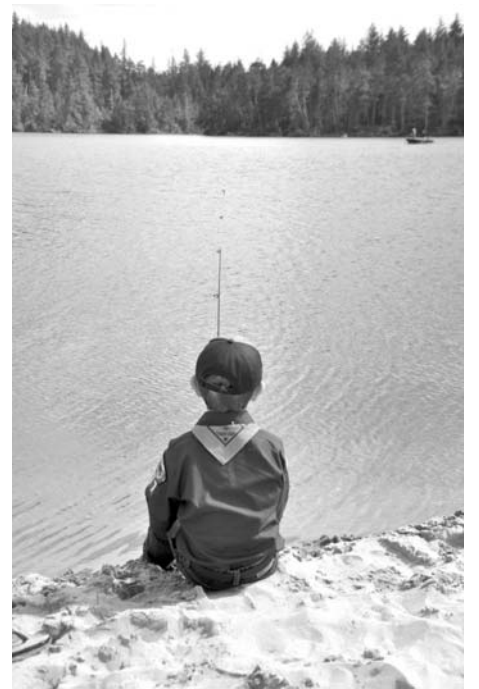
