## Correction

In the Feb. 25 edition of the Siuslaw News, the front-page article, "Cormorant Impact on the Rise," incorrectly stated that the Port of Siuslaw will receive \$15,000 annually from the Oregon State Marine Board (OSMB) to pay for upkeep of a floating restroom.

According to an OSMB spokesperson, the port will receive \$15,900 in maintenance assistance program (MAP) funds for all of its recreational boating facilities for the current fiscal year. The funding equates to \$13,500 in state boater funds and \$2,400 in federal funds, both of which include a matching

amount from the port.

If a floating restroom were made available for four months, the port would receive an additional \$4,083 in federal Clean Vessel Act funds (with the port providing \$1,361 in matching funds) for maintenance of the restroom. The Port of Siuslaw's total revised MAP funding would be \$19,983 for all of its facilities. Siuslaw News regrets the error.

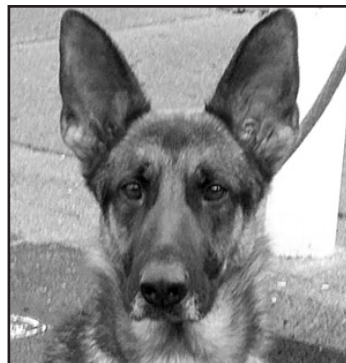
