Surfriders to present discussion on climate change at library

Climate change can be a daunting and overwhelming issue for Oregonians and the general public to wrestle with.

The impacts of climate change, from rising sea levels, ocean acidification and more intense storm activity, to warming ocean and global temperatures can leave one dizzied and confused for what can be done to adapt to the changing coastline.

On Wednesday, April 8, at 6 p.m., in the Siuslaw Public Library's Bromley Room, Surfrider's Oregon Policy Manager Charlie Plybon will give a community presentation touching on some of the drivers and impacts of climate change on the Oregon coast.

He will also highlight some key examples of how some coastal communities in Oregon are planning for climate adap-

These case studies present opportunities for individuals and communities to think about climate change in a new light. The presentation will be less about arguing the science, and more about modeling into the future: providing policy

and tradeoffs for longterm planning and decision-

making. "We need to think beyond today, tomorrow and the next 10 years for that matter," Plybon said about plan-






