OBITUARY

BURNETT—Udora M. Burnett, 80, of Deadwood, passed away April 14, from complications of a massive stroke.

She was born July 16, 1934 in Placerville, Calif., to Wayne and Elizabeth Tolson.

In the 1940s, the family moved to the Deadwood area, where she attended Mapleton schools and was in the 1953 class, but did not graduate.

She later received her GED

from Lane Community College and was awarded a certificate in Medical Terminology.

In 1951, she married Ray Burnett and they were married for more than 57 years until his passing in 2008.

They lived in Cheshire, Swisshome, and at Indian Creek on the Burnett Ranch before moving back to Deadwood, where her parents gave her some land to build a home on.

Udora raised five children and she still worked to help make ends meet. She drove a school bus to the strawberry and bean fields; washed dishes at a Florence restaurant where

she earned the nickname "Pearl Diver"; and was a line cook at the Gingerbread House restaurant in Mapleton; and pulled green chain for Eagle Veneer until the business closed down.

Udora was also a volunteer for the Swisshome Deadwood Fire Dept. and, after retirement, worked for the Lane County Solid Waste Dept. as a fee collector in Mapleton.

She is survived by her children: Barbara Beers of Indian Creek, Rose Meade of Florence, Donald and Debbie of Washington, Robert and Wally of Deadwood, Scott and Kelly of Florence, and her

adopted son, Mark, who spoiled her rotten; 12 grandchildren: Rayleen, Aimee, Nathaniel, James, Stephanie, Heather, Christina, Crystal, Joshua, Elizabeth, Jonathon and Carrie; 21 great-grandchildren; her sister, Roberta Wrinkle; her sister-in-law, Lillian Peterson; three nieces and one nephew.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Ray, and a nephew, David.

A funeral service will be held today, April 18, at noon, at Burns's Riverside Chapel Florence Funeral Home with interment at the Deadwood Cemetery.

Florence Police arrest Woodburn man for theft

Florence police officers caught and arrested David Savelieff, 24, of Woodburn on April 14 at 1:20 p.m.

Savelieff was in a stolen vehicle out of Salem that was parked on Rhododendron Drive close to Driftwood Shores.

According to Lt. John Pitcher, an officer was doing a routine patrol in the area, known for vacant vacation homes.

"His actions were suspicious, so we made contact," Pitcher said.

When Florence police officers searched Savelieff, he had special burglary keys, a lock pick set and keys to the stolen vehicle when arrested.

Inside the car were several pillow cases filled with

stolen items that led to a discovery of a house burglary in the Florence area.

Pitcher said that no burglary reports had been made in the area recently, but that officers keep watch in the area as burglaries have happened in the past.

"There are several vacation homes in the area, so at times there have been some long delays from when the burglary occurs compared to when it gets reported," he said.

Police also discovered methamphetamine in the stolen car. Savelieff was charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, unlawful possession of methamphetamine, unlawful possession for burglary tools, theft and burglary.

Savelieff was transported to Lane County correctional facility in Eugene.
