PeaceHealth awarded Certificate of Excellence

The Oregon Health Authority has awarded PeaceHealth Peace Harbor Medical Center with a Certificate of Excellence for exceeding the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services 2020 Healthcare Worker Influenza Vaccination goal of 90 percent.

Peace Harbor's healthcare worker influenza vaccination rate for 2013-2014 influenza

season was 94 percent, which makes it the third-highest in the state of Oregon for the 2013-2014 season.

"It is wonderful to be recognized by the state for our healthcare worker flu vaccination rates," said Cassandra Antosz, RN with Employee Health and Safety at PeaceHealth Peace Harbor Medical Center. "This just illustrates the commitment of our medical center and care-

givers to the safety and health of our patients and our community."

Immunizations of healthcare workers is a critical weapon in the fight against influenza virus infection, which causes thousands of hospitalizations and deaths annually, severely impacting vulnerable populations such as people with chronic medical conditions, young chil-

dren, infants, pregnant women and seniors.

Infected workers can inadvertently transmit influenza to patients and each other.

Oregon has been gradually adding requirements for mandatory reporting of vaccination rates in healthcare facilities and PeaceHealth Peace Harbor is among the highest in employee vaccination rates.

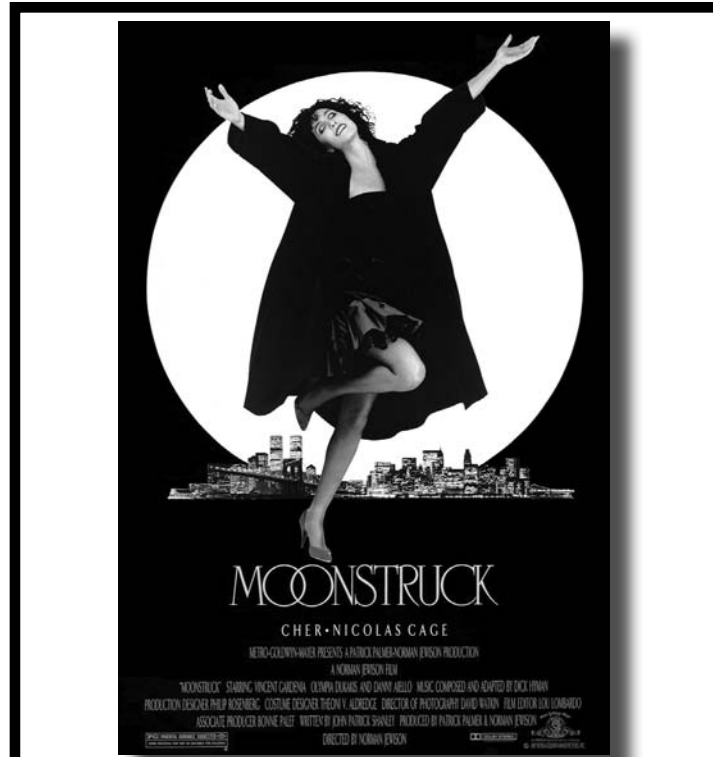
