NEWPORT — Wild animals are a centerpiece of visitor experience at the Oregon Coast Aquarium.

The morning of May 16, however, humans will take center stage as they compete in the Flippers, Feathers and Fins 5K and Kids' Dash.

Runners and walkers of all ages are invited to flock to Newport for the annual event, now in its third year.

The scenic route winds through the aquarium and along the Yaquina Bay estuary where racers will be greeted with facts about native wildlife.
