Admission to the Florence Green Fair is \$2 for adults and free for all children accompanied by an adult. However, anyone who brings a used plastic planter pot to be recycled will receive free admission.

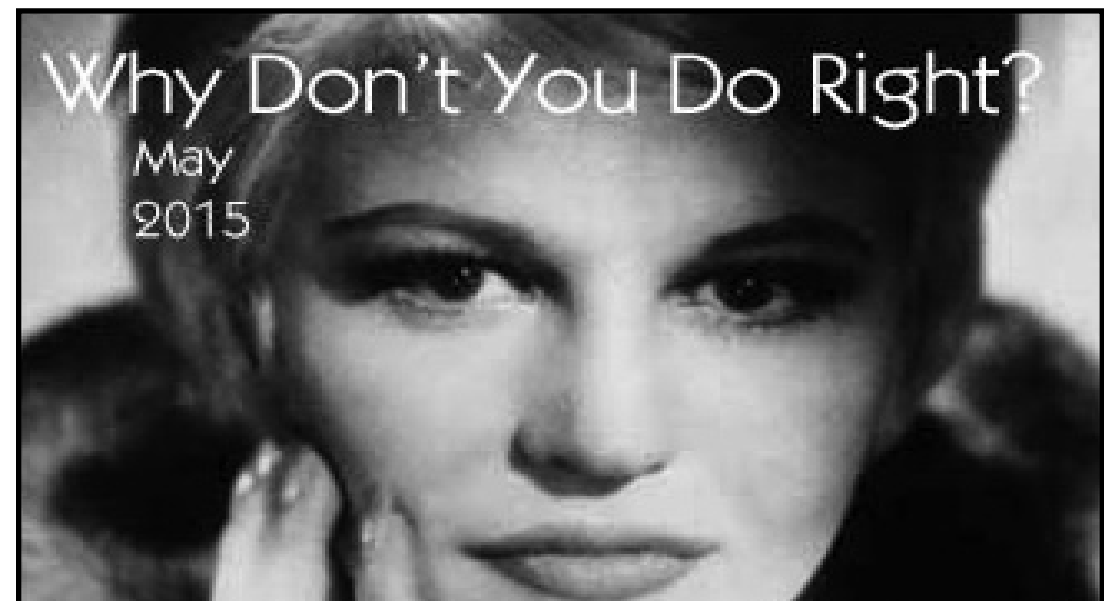
