Beethoven by the sea

Eugene **Symphony Review**

The Eugene Symphony Orchestra with conductor Danail Rachev brought its 49th season to a close on Friday, May 15, in Florence with selections from Samuel Barber, Haydn, Beethoven and a stunning featured solo by Principal Cello Anne Ridlington.

The dramatic one-time "Orchestra Showcase" concert was put together especially for the Florence Events Center appearance.

Friday night's show was also the final show in the local

Entertainment Association's 35th concert season at the FEC.

Beethoven's Symphony No. 6 (the "Pastoral Symphony") is one of the most played and most popular pieces in the classical repertoire and the orchestra seemed, as in Beethoven's first movement, to be enjoying an "awakening of joyful feelings on arrival in the country."

The orchestra, joined by a group of University of Oregon music students, played the piece's fourth movement thunderstorm and second movement bird calls (nightingale on flute, quail on oboe, cuckoo on two clarinets) for maximum

The full house at the FEC, perhaps resembling Beethoven's "merry gathering of country folk," in the third

movement, responded with appropriate enthusiasm and brought the season to a close with a standing ovation.

The concert opened with a smooth and emotive rendering of Samuel Barber's 1936 Adagio for Strings (once voted the saddest work in classical music, in a BBC poll).

The Adagio is extremely popular among broad audiences and has been featured in dozens of movies. It runs as a theme through the second half of the 1986 movie "Platoon."

Some may remember that it was one of President John F. Kennedy's favorites; Jackie Kennedy had the piece performed to an empty hall shortly after the assassination.

Mary Travers, of Peter Paul and Mary, asked that it be played at her funeral.

The highlight of the concert, however, was Principal Cello Anne Ridlington's performance of Haydn's Cello Concerto in D Major, in her first solo for the orchestra. The 35-year-old said she began playing violin at 3

years old and has been playing

the cello since she was 10. She managed the challenging athletic piece with grace and flair. Without once exposing the effort, she pulled notes from the bottom to the top of the fingerboard — by means of contortionist fingering - that are very rarely heard from this instrument.

Season tickets are now on

sale (seven concerts for the price of five) for the Seacoast Entertainment Association's fall season.

The new series will include Latin, Jazz, Pop and Classical artists, QUARTRO, in October; the Glen Miller Orchestra; SHUFFLE ("a group so multitalented they let the audience pick the playlist"); and Django Reinhardt style gypsy jazz with The New Hot Club of America.
