LRP's 'Spelling Bee' adult comedy opens June 12

In addition to musical direction, Jason is also playing the part of "William Barfee" (pronounced Bar-fay), the arrogant loner who has a lot to prove.

"Barfee has been picked on his entire life so his defenses are up. Friendship takes him by surprise," said Wood.

All of the characters personalities run deep and have stories that everyone can relate to: loneliness, puberty, sibling rivalry, etc.

This show is full of fun, humor, and some audience participation.

The play is suitable for more mature audiences, high school and above. Parental discretion is advised because the play is both comedic and adult at times. The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee will be playing Fridays and Saturdays, June 12, 13, 19 and 20, at 7 p.m., with matinee
