## REGISTRATION OPENS FOR CAPE MT. TRAIL RUN

The rugged Cape Mountain Trail Run, which is a challenging and scenic course that begins at Horse Creek Trailhead and loops through the single-track USFS Coast Horse Trail system, will take place June 13.

The 10-mile course has a 1,850-foot elevation gain with panoramic views of the Pacific

Ocean from several places along the course. The highest point is Cape Mountain Lookout, which was built by the CCC in the 1930s.

There will be a four-hour time limit, and an aid station will be at mile 4.5.

## Beachgoers: Keep away from seals, sea lions

ROSEBURG — Pacific harbor seal pupping season is in full swing on the Oregon coast. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife advises beachgoers to stay away from seals and sea lions resting on rocks or beaches.

A harbor seal mother often leaves her pup on shoreline rocks or the beach while she feeds in the sea.

“The pup isn’t stranded,

and human activity around it can discourage the female from returning to feed and care for her pup,” said Susan Riemer, marine biologist.

At this time of year, California sea lions are migrating south to breed for the summer, stopping to rest on Oregon beaches. Elephant seals are in the molting stage right now and may look sick, but molting is a natural process.

Seals and sea lions use beaches as a resting spot when feeling tired or ill and should be left alone. People should not approach them, or try to feed or help them. It’s important to keep dogs away as well.
