# Visitors reminded to be 'fire safe' in forests

CORVALLIS — With persistently warm and dry weather on the Oregon Coast this spring, Siuslaw National Forest officials have raised the Forest's fire danger level to "moderate" and are reminding visitors to be

mindful of fire safety this summer. "Although we're not as prone to wildfires as National Forests in arid regions, the Siuslaw National Forest does have a history of wildfires," said Dan Eddy, fire management officer. "Steep slopes and thick lay-

ers of organic material on the ground can provide opportunities for wildfires to grow and spread quickly."

The majority of fires on the Siuslaw National Forest are humancaused, Eddy said.

"Of the 15 recorded incidents we had last year, 14 of them were determined to be human-caused," he said, citing escaped campfires as the leading cause.

No fire restrictions for the public are in place, but visitors are asked to exercise caution when visiting natural areas:

- 1. Keep campfires small and in an area cleared down to mineral soil
- 2. Only burn materials that fit within the campfire ring
- 3. Be mindful of overhanging vegetation or limbs
- 4. Extinguish all campfires before leaving - even if gone for a short period of time.
