Wartnik is a member of the National Honor Society and earned a 4.0 GPA, with the exception of one "B" during her high school career.

country, chamber choir and was a wrestling statistician.

Roylance, the 2015 Queen Rhododendra, has been accepted to Brigham Young University-Idaho, with plans to become a high school counselor.
