the public's awareness of shellfish species to be avoided, those to keep eating, and ways to reduce exposure to known contaminants when possible.

While it is important for people to know about contaminants in shellfish, it is equally important to keep shellfish on the table. Health officials continue to encourage everyone to eat a variety of shellfish as part of a healthy diet.

"Because eating shellfish and other aquatic species can be an important part of a healthy diet, we want people to continue eating shellfish," said toxicologist David Farrer, Ph.D., of OHA's Public Health Division. "If they plan to consume soft-shell clams, we just recommend they remove the siphon skin before eating them."




